ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 20-08
ADDRESSING TEMPORARY SUSPENSION OF COURTESY COPY DELIVERIES

In response to the current state of emergency concerning the spread of COVID-19, and the need to take precautions to reduce the possibility of exposure to the virus among individuals, the Court has significantly reduced accessibility to non-court personnel of the Greenbelt and Baltimore Courthouses. Consistent with the objective of limiting outside individuals from entering the courthouse, the Court determines it is advisable to suspend temporarily the delivery by any method of courtesy copies of case filings.

The source of the obligations to deliver courtesy copies of documents and filings to the Bankruptcy Clerk’s office or to Chambers of the presiding judge, include:

- Local Bankruptcy Rule 7016-1(c)(2);
- Part XI(E) of Appendix H of the Local Bankruptcy Rules;
- Scheduling Orders for adversary proceedings and other contested matters; and

- General Practices for each Bankruptcy Judge Chambers published on www.mdb.uscourts.gov.

Accordingly, it is, by the United States Bankruptcy Court for the District of Maryland, ORDERED, that effective immediately, the requirement to deliver paper courtesy copies to the Clerk's Office or to the Chambers of a Bankruptcy Judge in this District is **temporarily suspended** unless otherwise ordered by a presiding judge in a particular case after the date of this Order; and it is further

ORDERED, this Order is effective upon entry and until further order of the Court.
