

Craig B. Young is a Partner in the Washington Office of Kutak Rock LLP. For more than 30 years, his practice has centered on bankruptcy law, creditors' rights and commercial litigation. Mr. Young earned his bachelor's degree and a Master of Science in the Technology of Management from The American University in Washington, D.C. Before he became a lawyer, for almost ten years Mr. Young was a management consultant with his own firm providing financial and management planning services to airports throughout the United States and overseas. Representative clients included Cleveland Hopkins International Airport (Ohio), Chemung County Airport (New York) and Kastrup Airport (Copenhagen, Denmark). Mr. Young received his Juris Doctorate from George Mason University School of Law, now known as the Antonin Scalia Law School at George Mason University, where he was Associate Editor of the GMU Law Review and published a comment on the regulation of airline routes. After law school, he served as pro se law clerk to U.S. District Judges Albert V. Bryan and James C. Cacheris in Alexandria, Virginia.

Mr. Young represents secured and unsecured creditors including creditors' committees; financial institutions and lenders; asset purchasers; landlords and tenants; equipment lessors and lessees; licensors and licensees of patents, copyrights and trademarks; and companies that provide goods and services. He also represents parties in commercial disputes and litigation in federal and state courts. Most recently, he served as lead counsel for the chapter 7 trustee in the bankruptcy of two corporations, investigating and pursuing recovery of several million dollars of preference payments and fraudulent transfers by insiders. *In re: Innovative Logistics Techniques, Inc., et al.*, U.S. Bankruptcy Court, Eastern District of Virginia (Alexandria).
