<b>Who are the debtors?</b>	Four cases are being jointly administered under this case number. The debtors are Diamond Comic Distributors, Inc., Comic Exporters, Inc., Comic Holdings, Inc., and Diamond Select Toys & Collectibles, LLC. Diamond Comic Distributors also does business using the names Alliance Games Distributors, Collectible Grading Authority, and Fandomworld. The debtors distribute comics, graphic novels, toys, games and pop culture merchandise.	
<b>When was this case filed?</b>	Diamond Comic Distributors, Inc. filed as a Chapter 11 bankruptcy case on January 14, 2025 in the United States Bankruptcy Court, District of Maryland. The case was converted to a proceeding under chapter 7 effective at midnight on December 31, 2025.	
<b>Is a chapter trustee serving in the case?</b>	Morgan W. Fisher was appointed as the chapter 7 trustee, effective upon conversion of the case from chapter 11 to chapter 7.	
<b>Is there anything that I am required to do?</b>	The Bankruptcy Clerk's Office cannot provide legal advice. If you have questions about how this case impacts your legal rights, please consult with an attorney.
