The MVLS is a private, non-profit legal services provider established to help meet the need for civil legal services in Maryland. Since 1981, MVLS has connected low-income Marylanders with volunteer lawyers and community partners to deliver free civil legal assistance, including bankruptcy services.

The Debtor Assistance Project ("DAP") is a legal clinic that is a partnership between the Bankruptcy Court and various members of the Maryland legal community. The DAP program provides debtors with an opportunity to meet, one-on-one, with a volunteer bankruptcy attorney for a no-cost half-hour consultation. While in person appointments are indefinitely suspended as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, since early 2020 the Telephonic DAP has been open and providing service.
